

Entrance Fees and Donations

While most museums charge no admission fee, they do welcome cash and other contributions. Museums pay their operating costs out of income generated by gifts, donations, sales from the gift shops, and other sources. Most museums must raise funds for utilities, cleaning, preservation, acquisition and building repairs. We urge all visitors to contribute something to the museums they visit.

Don't Throw it Out!

Most of the exhibits have been contributed by public-spirited friends, often family members or residents who have strong community ties. Each collection is unique, and each museum has its own personality.

Museums welcome donations of materials having historical interest. These include clothing, tools, artifacts of all kinds, photographs, letters, written records, objects of daily use, furniture, notebooks, musical instruments, signs and almost anything that would, when displayed or studied, give visitors and scholars a better understanding of the past. If you own, or know others who own such materials, please tell the docents or curators. Help us to preserve a good record of the past so that we can understand the present and prepare for the future.

General Historical Museums

This list of general historical museums in the San Gabriel Valley does not include all of the Valley's interesting historical places. Others are specialized exhibits, historic houses and sites that are not of general historical interest.

The Foothill Curators

Curators of San Gabriel Valley historical museums meet several times each year to discuss projects, problems and resources, and to assist each other in the operation of their museums, projects, outreach, funding and the like. This brochure is a project of the Foothill Curators.
